- 1. High Demand for Entry-Level Roles:** Over 17,000 postings exist for roles requiring 0–3 years of experience and an associate’s degree. (Data from November 2024-2025).
- 2. Regional Hotspots:** Washington-Arlington, NYC tri-state, and Dallas-Fort Worth lead growth; Texas tops states with 1,388 postings.
- 3. Stable Trends & Quick Hiring:** Postings average 1,370 per month with a 2:1 posting intensity, showing efficient hiring and retention.
- 4. Skills & Industries:** Employers seek AI, workflow, compliance skills plus soft skills; roles span healthcare, education, and government.
- 5. Competitive Pay:** Median salary for top 10 entry-level occupations is \$74,662, up 19.7% in three years, with hourly wages for all jobs averaging \$33.42.
